Werner-Cassidy was also the first director for Women Veterans of the Student Veterans of America, which involved traveling the country giving speeches and presentations in regards to veterans' educational and mental health needs, as well as participating on multiple panels.

Werner-Cassidy's appointment expands the MVRC board of directors from nine to ten members.
